ONLINE LEARNING DESIGNER ROLE DESCRIPTION

The College may vary this Role Description, in response to the changing needs of the organisation.

Core Role Purpose & Accountability

Working alongside the Technology Integrator and reporting to the Information Systems Manager (ISM), the Online Learning Designer's primary role is to collaborate with staff across the College to design and create innovative and engaging online learning programs to staff and students via our Learning Management System (LMS).

- Has an understanding of cognitive load, and how to design online programs in a way to reduce its impact
- Willing to show initiative; exercise creativity and adaptability; able to work as part of a team
- Strong communication skills, both verbal and written

- Enthusiastic about technology and its place in the classroom
- Committed to the success of staff and students within the College

Role Responsibilities

The Online Learning Designer is responsible for:

Spiritual and Religious Leadership

- Supporting the Mission Team to facilitate prayer/reflection experiences within the College
- Integrating the Benedictine values perspective into all policies and procedures

Developing the Learning Community

- Assist the ISM provide end-user support for the College's LMS to College staff
